Principles related to how children learn and develop

Children learn lots of things at the same time and in many different ways. They build on their knowledge and experience through play and active learning with hands-on experiences and in this way they develop dispositions, skills, attitudes and values, knowledge and understanding. On-going assessment ensures that experiences are built on and are relevant and meaningful. Communication and language are at the heart of early learning and development. An environment, indoor and outdoor which is representative of all children, influences what and how children learn, with good environments fostering independence, curiosity and a sense of belonging.
