In partnership with the adult, children will

- build respectful relationships
- 2 appreciate features that make a person special
- 3. understand that they are individuals with their own needs and interests
- 4 have a sense of 'who they are' and describe their backgrounds and abilities

- **6.** express preferences and needs and have these responded to.

In partnership with the adult, children will

- 1 develop a broad range of abilities and interests
- 2 show awareness of their strengths and abilities, and share these with others
- show increasing self-assurance in directing their own learning
 demonstrate dispositions like curiosity.

- to personal interests, home and culture
- be motivated, and recognise their progress and achievements.

Children will see themselves as capable learners.

Aim 3

Children will have an understanding of rights.

Learning goals

In partnership with the adult, children will

- 1. express their views and help make decisions in matters that affect them
- understand the rules and boundaries of acceptable behaviour
- interact, work co-operatively and help others
- respect others' needs, rights, feelings, culture, language, and religious beliefs
- 5 have a sense of social justice and deal with unfair behaviour
- demonstrate co-operation, responsibility, negotiation, and conflict resolution.
